The Central Newfoundland Waste Management (CNWM)

The CNWMA is a democratic collection of Municipal leaders appointed by the Province to oversee the construction and operations of the Central Newfoundland Waste Management Strategy. The Greater Central Newfoundland Region includes the area from Terra Nova National Park in the East, Buchan’s in the West and Fogo Island in the North.

The Board of Directors of the Authority will make decisions pertaining to :

- The construction and operation of regional solid waste disposal sites including a facility designated in the regulations as a regional facility
- The charging of user fees on Municipal Authorities, areas under development control or unincorporated areas benefited by a regional facility

Board members will operate in accordance with the expectations of the Regional Service Board Act.

I am pleased in this our first newsletter to introduce our newly appointed Board of Directors for the Central Newfoundland Waste Management. These Directors will be working of behalf of the Municipalities in their areas to shape what will be the first modern waste management system in the Province.

After planning and designing this system since 2002 we are now in the construction phase. Our system will go into partial operation by 2010 at which time we will be in a position to close out existing landfills. By 2012 we will be fully operational which will mean that all recyclable products will be removed from the landfill and all organic materials will be composted. The details on separation and how each community will dispose of its waste will be in future newsletters.

Provincial Solid Waste Management Strategy in Central Newfoundland.

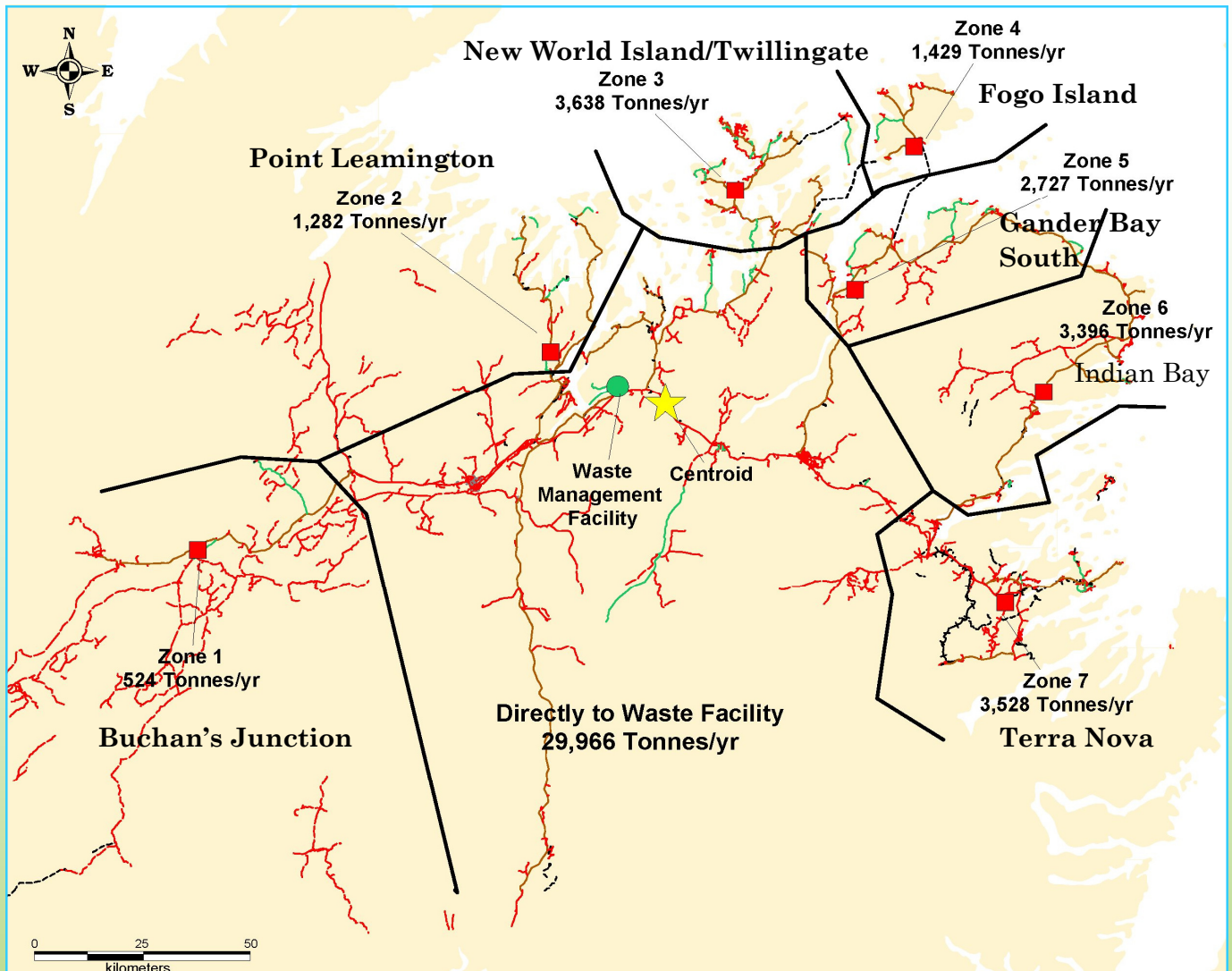
I would also like to congratulate the board on the launch of this informative and educational newsletter.

Provincial Waste Management Strategy: Points of interest

- Divert 50% of materials going to disposal by 2015
- Reduce number of waste disposal sites by 80% by 2020
- Phase out use of unlined landfill sites by 2020
- Full Province wide Modern Waste Management by 2020
- Central Newfoundland Waste Management System operational by 2012

Source Separation: Wet/Dry Program - the program involves separating your wet and dry waste, using blue transparent and green transparent bags.

DRY PROGRAM

WET PROGRAM

Dry waste consists of all items that are dry, which includes both recyclable and non-recyclable materials.

Wet waste includes all food and yard waste, in addition to any soiled items that would contaminate your recyclables.

Dry waste must be placed in a **BLUE** transparent bag. Please shake, wipe or rinse DRY waste clean to ensure it can be recycled.

All WET waste must be placed in a **GREEN** transparent bag. Items that could contaminate recyclables in the DRY waste belong in the WET.

Some items for DRY program include:

- Aluminum cans, juice cans
- All types of Cardboard and Paper Products
- Fabrics and Clothes
- All types of Plastics
- Glass

Some items for WET program include:

- All Food scraps, meats, tea bags
- Baby wipes, bandages, cotton swabs, diapers
- Grass clippings and leaves
- Paper Plates (soiled)

Source Separation: Household Hazardous Waste

If used or disposed of improperly, Household Hazardous Waste (HHW) can cause harm to the environment and to your health.

Some Items for the Household Hazardous Waste are:

- Antifreeze
- Batteries (Automotive & household)
- Cleaners/medications
- Fuels/motor oil & filters
- Paint & Paint Products
- Pesticides/Herbicides
- Propane tanks
- Aerosol cans
