- 2. Why the Central NF Waste Management Committee was invited to this meeting at New-Wes-Valley.

The dump site of New-Wes-Valley will soon be closing. There were issues re: extended life of this site - NF Power easements, watershed area concerns, etc.

CECON had completed a waste management study for New-Wes-Valley with financial support from Department of Municipal and Provincial Affairs. They have recommended a site for a transfer station. Gander has offered to take their garbage for a two (2) year period.

Funding to support the development of this transfer station has not been given, government wants to see if this development fits into the Central NF Waste Management Strategy.

A Scott gave an update on the Phase I study and indicated where Phase II was going. The preliminary review was that a transfer station could be located by Indian Bay, CECON recommended one in the New-Wes-Valley area. Early indication show that by locating it in New-Wes-Valley there would be an

overall \$5,000 per year extra cost for communities to haul to this location (New-Wes-Valley) and an additional \$16,000 per year to haul from there to the centroid. A total of \$21,000 per year extra cost for that part of the region which all the regional may have to support.

Phase II will do a more in-depth study on location and costs of transfer station.

It was agreed that Bae NewPlan and CECON would review the data and cost estimates, possible location of transfer station and try and work together, government included, to find an intern solution, with cost associates and possible government subsidizes.
